

## Home Learning:

Your maths home learning can be found on the school website as well as the copy given to you by your teacher. You should record the task and the due date in your ROA as usual.

Tasks should be completed in your book. Finding the solution is not necessarily the important thing. Ensure that you include in your book, a clear and full explanation of how you went about solving the problem. Include any use of equipment, diagrams or pictures that have been useful. If you tried to solve it one way and failed to reach a successful outcome, show why this didn't work and what you then tried.

If you complete the task and your explanation quickly, create a similar problem of your own including a worked solution.

Merits will be awarded for full and clear explanations, regardless of successfully answering the problem.

## Challenge Home Learning:

Each week, you should be choosing an area of learning to work on at home. This could be something that you have found hard in class which needs further practice. Or maybe something that you recently got wrong in a test which needs some further study. Alternatively, you might choose something which interests you which you might like to explore at a greater depth. On the school website or in your maths passports you will find some suggestions of things that may be useful to support your learning.

Your book is a sensible place to record any written work which you have undertaken to support your Challenge Home Learning. Alternatively, there may be some other relevant evidence which you could bring in to support the discussion about your independent learning. Remember, we will be asking you, "What you have learned? Why did you choose that? How did you go about learning this?"
