## Year 8: Blues

## **Key Words**

**blues** – a style of early jazz, often vocal, descended from African-American work songs and spirituals.

**scat** – a type of blues singing using nonsense syllables instead of words.

**syncopation** – emphasis on the 'off-beats'.

**call and response** – where one person or group sings or plays a line, and is then answered by another person or group.

**improvisation** – when a musician makes up the music on the spot.

**12-bar blues** – a pattern of chords in the order:

$$C - C - C - C$$

$$F - F - C - C$$

$$G - F - C - C$$

**fluency** – keeping going, even if you make a mistake.

**accuracy** – correct notes and rhythms.

**ensemble** – sense of togetherness with other musicians.

Using Spotify or YouTube, listen to some blues performers. You could try Elmore James, *Dust My Broom* and Robert Johnson, *Crossroad Blues*.
