Year 6 SATs begin Monday 13/5/19

Please support your child to remain calm and rested this weekend. Here are our messages for students for the weekend in preparation for the SATs:

1. Go to bed nice and early on Sunday - get used to turning off screens half an hour before bed in preparation for the week.

2. Eat well- get plenty of protein to boost your brain cells.

3. The hard work is all done, all you need to do now is go for it!

Please remember to arrive in plenty of time for the power snack each morning- arrive at 8:25am, put things away in tutor rooms, then join your form in the hall.

Our key message to students has, and continues to be that the most important thing is to know they have given the SATs their best shot and tried their hardest. This is the most important thing to gain from the SATs: a confidence that they can commit to hard work and improvement. We also regularly remind students that how they do in their test is not so important, it is only 4 days in one year of testing. No one is going to ask them as an adult how they did in their SATs and they will continue to keep learning with us after. After the exams, lessons and the school day will continue as normal. On Friday, students will have lessons as normal periods 1 and 2, carry out a Geography project called the Trade Aid game periods 3 and 4, and during the afternoon watch the Spider Wick Chronicles as part of their English scheme of work.

How aware are you of your child's Instagram use?

Are you aware of a site called Tellonym? This is a site that allows students the ability to post information anonymously and is currently being accessed via Instagram. Year 8 Parents will receive a letter with regard to this, as the postings that have gone up seem specific to them. However, we wanted to alert all parents to the site as it's anonymity is encouraging really spiteful abuse. We have alerted the Community Police officers who will be coming in to talk to students, but can we encourage you to take extra vigilance in checking your child's use of Instagram? Please be aware this site is for age thirteen and over. Thank you for any help you can give.
