As the school expands in numbers again, our Year 6 cohort is set to be joined by another class of students, who have chosen to select Edwinstree and then Freman College as their next destination. Due to this

increase in numbers, we will need to make changes to the classes. Parents will be notified of the class changes on Transition Day on 11th July 2019. Please be aware, just like last year, friendship groups and vulnerable students will be considered. Please note, s a Year 6 parent, once into Key Stage 3, students will remain in the same class in Year 8.

Message from the Leader of Science

As a Science department, we are keen to support your child to experiment in as many lessons as possible. In order to do this we must follow strict Health and Safety Guidelines. Please be aware that nail polish and fake nails etc are not permitted in science lessons due to these concerns; students will be required to remove them and nail polish remover is available in school. It is also important that long hair is tied back and students should have a hair band ready, whenever they have a science lesson. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping your child safe in school!

PSHCEE

Over the summer term, all students will be covering Sex and Relationship Education (SRE) as part of their PSHCEE lessons. Year 5 will cover puberty and the changes that the body will go through, Year 6 will look at how babies are made and the importance of being in a loving and caring relationship. Year 7 will focus on physical and emotional changes in puberty, building on work done in Year 5. This topic also looks at relationships and the need to maintain healthy relationships. Year 8 will look at sexually transmitted

infections and the importance of protecting themselves when in relationships. They will also consider Female Genital Mutilation. All lessons will be taught in an extremely sensitive manner, using government guidelines. It is the law that schools cover this content, however, should you have any concerns or require further information, please feel free to contact your child's PSHCEE teacher or Miss Bustard.
