Will this second school closure harm my child's future education and is the damage irretrievable?

Having spoken to a significant proportion of the parent body this week, one of the key messages coming back was your continued worry and concern regarding the long term impact of being out of school for so long. This has led to some parents thinking they were letting their child down. I understand completely, having recently attended a parents evening for my daughter in Year 9, I had not realised the level of concern that I had pushed down and ignored over this half term period. I found myself facing a wall of anxiety about her future and the impact of lockdown. I don't think the press has helped, with their ever sweeping statements about the months students are behind and the plans to "catch up".

Please remember, your children have time on their side in order to reach their best potential, prior to GCSEs and A levels. If this had to happen, far better it occurred at this stage of their education and I would like to reassure you that the capacity of children to learn, once secure and settled back in school is strong.

As a Parent, how do I maintain the wellbeing of myself and my child around school work?

Remember, your wellbeing is a priority. Make sure that you focus on Maths and English first. If your child is struggling, notify the teacher via the comments box in SMHW, and or attend the live lounge/ chat events. These sessions really help students to speak to the teacher and iron out problems. Celebrate the different learning that is taking place, many of you have told us of a new skill they have acquired. Cherish the time you have had together as a family and take comfort.

Do we have any idea when schools will return?

No – There is potential for the 8th March but this is not official and we have had no confirmation. We are hoping that we will have some clarity on 22nd February, but again please be aware this will remain dependent on COVID-19.

What about catch-up, extended days and shorter summer holidays?

Apologies, but most of these announcements come as surprises to us. As soon as we have clarity we will let you know. Edwinstree is clear that any catch-up programme is not a quick fix, but will need to be long term and sustained in order to support students to make concrete learning steps.

When students return, will they be on their COVID timetable or will they return to a timetable with all their subjects?

Unfortunately I don't know, but we plan to prepare for the timetable we hoped to put in place after October half term, which allows all students to experience all subjects over a two week timetable. This involves a greater mix of teachers and students, however, if we cannot instigate this before Easter, we hope to after the Easter break.

What about the missing subjects from my child's timetable? When will they get to cover these?

We hope to return to a fuller timetable after Easter, but in the meantime, we have made a few changes to the curriculum to support new foundation subject learning in each year group.

Timetable after half term

A copy of the timetable we will be running after half term is attached to the newsletter and available on the school website. The changes were being made to enable core subjects to be in a better position to support students at home. We have managed to do this for our Y5 and Y6 students.

These are the headline changes to the provision being offered in school:

Year 5

- Art instead of Humanities
- Mrs Barrett delivering science

Year 6

- Miss Bull delivering Science
- Mr Kelly delivering Humanities and RE
- Mr Hamilton delivering ICT

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Year 7

- Ms Gravelle delivering in school Science; Ms Sanders supporting online
- From 8/3/21Technology will move to Humanities

Year 8

- Wellbeing through Art instead of Technology
- History instead of Geography
- Ms Gravelle delivering in school Science; Ms Sanders supporting online

Live events

With the changes to the timetable, there will also be changes to the live events offered. We will publish this list towards the end of the first week back. However, links will continue to be published with the work and available in Teams. Please can we encourage you to log into Teams as this is the best way to track when live events are taking place? A reminder of how to do this is below.

What is the best way to access LIVE lessons? The calendar in Teams will show them when the sessions are taking place and at what time. You also have the option to turn on notifications for events. You could download the Teams app (available on a laptop, computer, tablet, or phone) or log into Teams through Office 365. All students have a login, which is their school email address and password.

What is their school email address? It is their computer login plus <u>@edwinstree.herts.sch.uk.</u> Their computer login is the year their year group started at Edwinstree, their first name and first letter of their surname (with a few exceptions). An example, the login for a Y7 student called Sarah Winter (even if she started this academic year) would be <u>18sarahw@edwinstree.herts.sch.uk</u>

What is their password? The password is the same password they would use to log into the computers at school. These cannot be reset or changed at home. If your child struggles to access Teams and/or remember their password please contact Mrs Heywood on <u>r.heywood@edwinstree.herts.sch.uk</u>. If you don't want to use the app or Office 365 and enter sessions as a 'guest', your child needs to enter their full name and class name as their 'guest name'. We are monitoring who we let into the Teams lobby for safeguarding purposes.

Will Lateral Flow Tests be carried out in school on their return? What about the children currently in school?

We have LFT kits for testing Year 7 and 8, but the latest guidance from Public Health has advised against using lateral flow testing in school because of the increased risks of the new variants. Testing of students will be suspended until we have further notification.

Will we still get daily phone calls to check if my child is not online?

Yes – It is a Government requirement to register daily online learning. We check at 11am daily and will contact you if we cannot see that your child is online, collecting hard copy, on an in-school leaning track or registered as unwell.

What happens if my child or a family member tests positive for Covid-19?

Year 6 Science

After half term, Year 6 will be studying the heart in in more detail. We will be dissecting a lamb's heart to gain some practical experience of a heart and details of how to safely dissect a lamb's heart will be published in the distance learning pack. We wanted to make you aware so you could order a whole lamb's heart from the butchers if you wish to complete the dissection with your child at home. If you are unable to complete this practical at home, there will be a video included for students to use to watch to inform their learning.

What staff changes are taking place after half term?

We are exceedingly sorry to say goodbye to our science teacher Ms Davies. Mrs Barret will be taking over the lead for Year 5 and Year 6 in school and out. We also are pleased to welcome Ms Gravelle, an experienced science teacher, who will join our science team. We are also alerting you that Mrs Van Wyk will be on loan to Freman College from 8th March until September, in order to cover maternity leave for Food Technology. We are currently recruiting a replacement Humanities teacher and we will then return Geography and RE into the Year 7 curriculum. Mrs Van Wyk will return after the summer.

SEND update

As Miss Campany is now on maternity leave we wanted to alert you to how we will distribute the SENCO role during her absence. We are pleased to advise you that Ms Malley, SENCO at Freman College who will be supporting us in an advisory role, overseeing the Educational Health Care Plan reviews and guiding us through the new 'banding' process. Ms Malley will arrange for parents and carers of students who are due a review of their EHCP in the summer term to be contacted next half term.
