When is Open Evening and what is it about? Is my child involved?

Is the Merit Text home working?

Thank you for letting us know that you are really enjoying the positive conversations you are having with your child about their merits. In reviewing our behaviour data this month, we can see that there are over ten times as many merits as negatives in our first month. Please congratulate your child on their positive start to the term.

If I am buying a winter coat and shoes what do I need to think about?

Following our stay safe training last year, it became abundantly clear that asking students to have a dark coloured coat meant they were difficult to see when exiting the school. We are very supportive of children wearing a bright coat through the winter months. We are worried that there are still a small minority of students wearing canvas type black shoes, as we come to the rainy season we look forward to seeing them move to a more appropriate footwear.

Year 8

Year 8 have made a positive start to the year and it is lovely to hear the Year 5s explain how relieved they are that the older year groups are kind and considerate to them around the school.

Thank you to the significant number of parents who attended the SATs' evening to support their child during this next year. Please remember, this is about keeping them calm and helping them to do their best. The most important thing for your child is that they finish SATs with a sense of pride that they gave it their best shot. This is the important learning that will support them later in life.

Year 5

We have been working with Year 5 on what it means to be a Church of England school. Sadly over the last two weeks, we have had four incidents of racism within the year group. In Collective Worship this week, we explored the importance of celebrating us and individuals and helping to find our 'wonderful'. We considered diversity and equality as key themes that thread not only through British society but through the Christian Church. We are currently securing the 'Say No to Racism' group to support Year 5 to celebrate diversity and not to fear it.

Members of GIST Limited, will provide a Road Safety Presentation to Year 5 next month to support our emphasis on staying safe when crossing the road. As part of the visit, students will have the opportunity to sit in an HGV lorry and experience what it is like to see pedestrians from a driver's viewpoint.

Attached with the newsletter is our feedback from the Year 5 Parents' Evening and we are pleased that so many of the children are settling well into Edwinstree. One area of concern is that 10 people 'did not know whether the school dealt with bullying effectively'.

Please can I stress, if you have any concerns or worries for your child about repeated poor behaviour, please do not hesitate to get in touch the email address of the head of year is in your child's ROA.

Don't leave even the smallest niggles, let us know. To reassure you, my Senior Leadership Team take lunch with Year 5s and one of the questions we ask is 'what surprised you about Edwinstree?'. One of the most common answers is the upper year groups "who have been really kind".

Three parents identified a concern over whether students from different backgrounds get on with each other and we will be tackling this issue during this term, to make sure that students are clear why, Edwinstree as a Church of England school, welcomes and celebrates diversity and why this is important. Three parents didn't know whether students behaved well in school. Our current behaviour data tells us that they do behave, and where they make a mistake, almost all are learning from it and not repeating.

Year 5

Next week, Year 5 will be nominating a member of the school community they have seen embody our Christian values. The nominees will be announced each week in Year 5 Collective Worship, published in the Newsletter and given a Merit. These nominations can be to anyone in the school volunteers, visitors, students or staff.

This is part of their student voice so please encourage them to discuss with you after it has been introduced. We look forward to seeing our cohort embody the 'spirit' of Edwinstree and our Christian values. Thank you
