
We want you to get things WRONG!


What do I need to bring to school?

Maths

Keep up with your times tables. Knowing these is the key to nearly all areas of maths. You could listen to songs, get somebody at home to test you, play games, make your up your own game or use any method you prefer to help you remember them. Practise life skills related to maths, for example; learn to tell the time on the different clocks, analogue and digital – including the 24 hour clock; learn to read a timetable for a bus or train; do some cooking and find out how much the ingredients weigh or convert a recipe for a different amount of people; count your pocket money; find out how long a journey is in miles and kilometres and how long it takes. We look forward to meeting you all in September.
